# Why Is It Important To Attend The SBSA Business Meeting?

For starters, that's when it's easiest to meet the directors and officers and present any business you wish. This is where members can directly affect the business of our association and new initiatives may be considered.

Secondly, the SBSA By-Laws (excerpts below) call for directors' elections bi-annually (every two years). If you or a shipmate want to be elected, you have to be nominated and seconded by current members. The present Board of Directors usually presents a slate of nominees, but there will be an opportunity to nominate from the floor. If you wish to put in a name for the directors slate, please contact Secretary/Treasurer Gene Hart -see page 4 (bottom-left) for contact info.

--- EXCERPTED FROM THE SBSA BY-LAWS ---

#### 2. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 2.1 <u>Management by Board of Directors</u>. The business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its board of directors.
- 2.2 Number, Tenure, Qualifications and Election of Directors. The number of directors of the corporation shall be nine (9), which number may be increased or decreased (but not to less than three (3)), by amendment to this bylaw, but no decrease shall have the effect of shortening the term of any incumbent director. Each director shall hold office for a term of four (4) years and/or until a successor has been elected and qualified, unless the director sooner resigns or is removed as provided in these Bylaws. Initial terms of new director positions may be set for less than four (4) years by the existing board of directors. Directors need not be residents of the State of Montana, but must be currently dues-paid members of Swift Boat Sailors Association. Directors shall be elected by and from the Active Members in good standing of the association as defined in Section 6.6 of these bylaws. Additionally, a director is required to have a personal computer with 24-hour internet access.

#### 3. OFFICERS

- 3.1 <u>Required and Permissible Officers</u>. The officers of this corporation must be currently dues-paid members, and shall include a president, a vice president, a secretary and a treasurer. In the discretion of the board of directors, it shall be permissible to elect a chairman of the board, one or more vice presidents, assistant secretaries and assistant treasurers. The same person may hold any two or more offices. Such other officers and assistant officers and agents as may be deemed necessary may be elected or appointed by the board of directors.
- 3.2 <u>Elections and Term of Office</u>. The officers of the corporation to be elected by the board of directors shall be elected biannually by the board of directors at the regular meeting of the board of directors. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as is convenient. Each officer shall hold office until a successor is duly elected or until the officer's death, resignation or removal. The officers shall have such duties, in addition to those expressed herein, as the board of directors shall specify from time to time.



## **VA Adds Maps to Online Gravesite Locator**

WASHINGTON (June 20, 2006)- The grave locations of more than three million veterans and dependents buried in national cemeteries can be found more easily now because the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has added maps of burial sections online that can be printed from home computers and at national cemetery kiosks.

The latest improvement builds upon a service begun two years ago, in which a VA online feature permits family members to find the cemetery in which their loved one is buried.

"This new map feature makes it easier for families, friends and researchers to find the exact location of a veteran's grave in all national cemeteries and some state veterans cemeteries," said the Honorable R. James Nicholson, Secretary of Veterans Affairs. "It enhances VA's service at national cemeteries, already highly regarded, and our commitment to them as national shrines and historical treasures."

The gravesite locator (<a href="http://gravelocator.cem.va.gov">http://gravelocator.cem.va.gov</a> Antip:// gravelocator.cem.va.gov/>), online since April 2004, helps veterans' families, former comrades-in-arms and others find the cemeteries where veterans are buried. With the new online feature, people enter a veteran's name to search, click on the "Buried At" (burial location) link and a map of the national cemetery is displayed, showing the section where the grave is located.

In a related development, VA recently added to its database the cemeteries in which 1.9 million veterans were buried with VA grave markers. These are mostly private cemeteries. This addition brings the number of graves recorded in the locator to approximately five million. Those with maps are in VA national cemeteries and in state veterans cemeteries and Arlington National Cemetery if burials were since 1999

Beyond the five million records now available, VA continues to add approximately

1,000 new records to the database each day. VA also plans to add to its online database the exact locations of veterans' gravesites in the remaining state veterans cemeteries.


In the midst of the largest cemetery expansion since the Civil War, VA operates 123 national cemeteries in 39 states and Puerto Rico and 33 soldiers' lots and monument sites. More than three million Americans, including veterans of every war and conflict - from the Revolutionary


War to the Global War on Terror - are buried in VA's national cemeteries on more than 16,000 acres of land.

Veterans with a discharge other than dishonorable, their spouses, and eligible dependent children may be buried in a national cemetery. Other burial benefits include a burial flag, Presidential Memorial Certificate, and a government headstone or marker - even if they are not

buried in a national cemetery. Information on VA burial benefits can be obtained from national cemetery offices, from the Internet at http://www.cem.va.gov or by calling VA regional offices toll-free at 1 800-827-1000.

Harold W. Gehman, Jr. (USN Ret.)

**EDUCATION:** Pennsylvania State University, bachelor's in industrial engineering

**OCCUPATION:** U.S. Navy, retired as admiral


CAREER: Gehman's Naval career included two tours in Vietnam, first as officer-in-charge of PCF-27, then as senior officer-in-charge of seven swift boats at Chu Lai. At sea, he commanded the guided missile destroyer USS Dahlgren; the 6th Fleet flagship USS Belknap, a guided missile cruiser; the rescue and salvage ship USS Conserver; and Cruiser-Destroyer Group 8 with the carrier USS Eisenhower. He held several posts in the U.S. Atlantic Command headquarters, including as deputy commander in chief, and from 1996-1997 was vice chief of Naval Operations. He was commander in chief of the U.S. Joint Forces Command from 1997 until his retirement Sept. 5, 2000. He later headed the investigation into the USS Cole bombing on Oct. 12, 2000, which killed 17 sailors. He was Chairman of the space shuttle "Columbia" investigation board in 2003. Most recently Admiral Gehman was a member of the 2005 Base Realignment and Closing Commission (known as BRAC).

**OTHER:** As first commander of the Joint Forces Command, was given added responsibility of coordinating U.S. military support to civilian agencies in event of attack on U.S. territory by nuclear, biological or chemical weapons.
