Auxiliary Participation in USS Zumwalt Christening

U.S. Navy Captain James A. Kirk and the crew of the USS Zumwalt (DDG 1000) invited Joe Muharsky, a member of Flotilla 7-6, to the Mast Stepping Ceremony and formal christening on April 12, 2014 in Bath, Maine. Joe also received a formal invitation to the christening of the ship from Admiral Zumwalts son Jim and daughtes Mouzetta and Ann. The ship is named for the former Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral Elmo R. Zumwalt. As CNO during the Vietnam War from 1970 - 1974, Admiral Zumwalt was responsible for the "Brown water Navy", which was an elite force of Swift Boats that patroled the waterways in Vietnam. One of the Swift Boat Commanders was his son, Elmo Zumwalt III. Joe Muharsky served on a Swift Boat during this time.

Joe was honored to be part of this very special occasion. He and his family were privileged to sit with the Zumwalt family during the Mast Stepping Ceremony. At the beginning of the ceremony Joe was introduced as a Swift Boat sailor who is now an active member of the

U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary. During the ceremony the "coin for 1969" was presented to Joe. He then gave the coin to one of the ship's officers. This tradition began with the ancient Greeks and Romans. During the Mast Stepping Ceremony coins and momentos are put in a box that is then placed at the base of the ship's mast. This becomes a permanent part of the ship that will ensure a safe passage for the crew.

Joe and his wife Donna were asked to march in front of the crew for a half mile down the street, leading the way to the christening. Joe was given the honor of speaking at the Maine Maritime Museum with Larry Berman, author



of Zumwalt: The Life and Times of Admiral Elmo Russel "Bud" Zumwalt, Jr. Joe is mentioned in the book.



New Book Tempest in a Teacup

Doc White is a photographer and Swift Boat veteran from San Diego and has written a piece of fiction about his experience in Vietnam.

Teacups have held the brew that has sustained revolutions, cultivated thought and nurtured friendships for thousands of years. In *Tempest in a Teacup*, they hold all this and more — a long-lost treasure of incalculable wealth — second chances.

Two friends—one Navy SEAL and one Swift Boater—return to their shared war zone on a last mission: to recover a sunken treasure in the hopes of restoring some of what was lost there 25 years ago while reaffirming the rare bond they had all along.

He states in his forward that "writing about Vietnam and my time on Swift Boats brought back sharp, sometimes painful memories. But my most poignant and precious reflections dwell on the friendships forged in war and kept strong over a half a century."

Honoring the Men of Malta Lost on Swift

The Maritime Museum of San Diego and the Swift Boat Sailors Association conducted a memorial service on Sunday 7 September 2014 to honor five Maltese Swift Boat Sailors and two Maltese Policemen lost aboard Swift Boat P 23 (formally PCF 813) on this anniversary of that tragic event. These men were taking illegal fireworks to be dumped at sea when a massive explosion killed all but one man. Two men were not recovered. The only survivor, a Swift Boat Sailor managed to beach the Swift Boat before it sank.

Mr. Hugh Cassar, Consul General of Malta in Southern California and Mr. Louis J. Vella, Consul General of Malta in Northern California together with 14 Maltese citizens participated in this memorial event. The entire group boarded Swift Boat PCF 816 and sailed to Glorietta Bay next to the US Naval Amphibious Base to lay a wreath on the water. A proclamation was read by Mr. Cassar dedicating this day to honor these seven men who are *Still on Patrol*.

We rang the ship's bell for each man, and seven Maltese individuals took turns and said, "We remember..." and read the name for each man lost in the service of the Republic of Malta:

Bombardier Francis Berg Private Anthony Farrugia Police Constable Joseph Hare Police Sergeant Savior Muscat Bombardier Joseph Pace Gunner William Simpson Private Anthony Vella

Ray Ashley, CEO of the Maritime Museum thanked the Republic of Malta in behalf of the SBSA and the museum for donating PCF 816 so that we may keep these memories alive.

The Maltese flag always flies from the mast of PCF 816 next to the American ensign. We presented two of these Maltese flags to Mr. Vella. He presented one of these flags to the Maltese Maritime Squadron and one to the Maltese Police on 3 October in Valletta, Malta.

We honor the memory of these seven Swift Boat Sailors as we do for our fifty Swift Boat Sailors and they will never be forgotten. Bob Bolger initiated and coordinated this event. His wife Val created the wreath.
