
SAN ANTONIO SBSA 2011 REUNION

On March 12, 1942, LT. John D. Bulkeley and his valiant crew, along with a second PT Boat, successfully evacuated General Douglas MacArthur, his family and staff from Corregidor to Mindanao, crossing more than 600 miles of open sea to safety.

Vice Admiral Bulkeley's heroic actions in the Pacific Theatre, as Lieutenant Commander and as the Commander of Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron Three at Cavite, Philippines, earned him our Nation's highest decoration - The Medal of Honor.



Minutes of 2011 SBSA General Meeting

May 7, 2011 San Antonio

- 1. Chairman Dave Wallace called the meeting to order approximately 9:15AM and declared a guorum.
- 2. Gene Hart gave a membership report 582 members plus some who joined at the reunion. 82 delinquent members.
- 3. Gene Hart gave the treasurer's report As of Jan 1 \$64,786.55, income through March \$16,125.46, expenses through March \$1,477.63. He reported that the ship's store was self sustaining.
- 4. Dave and Raul Herrera played the video from the Warrior and Family Support Center and reported that the Board voted to donate \$5,000 and that Judith Markelz, Director, would accept the check at the banquet.
- Dave introduced Senyint Chim who recounted his rescue by a PCF in Cambodia. Senyint introduced George Nelson who was on the rescuing boat who recounted his recollection of the event.
- 6. Dave gave the status of the Maltese PCF which was essentially still up in the air due to the events in Libya. Plan was to work with the San Diego Maritime Museum for maintenance and public availability. Swifties would be able to qualify as docents. How to get it to San Diego was still to be determined.
- 7. Dave reported that the status of PCF 104 was renewed for an additional 5 years with the Navy Historical Society.
- 8. Dave reported that the next reunion would be in 2013 in San Diego.
- 9. Board elections were held. The following were elected to the board: Dave Wallace, Robert Brant, Van Odel, Chuck Rabel.
- 10. Meeting was adjourned approximately 11:00AM

President's Corner

Memories of the 2011 SBSA Reunion in San Antonio, Texas last month will be long lasting. I'm certain that those that attended share my sentiment. To those of you who were unable to attend, this newsletter will hopefully encourage you to plan ahead for 2013 when we will make our way to San Diego, California.

The event got underway with a Welcome Reception – Fiesta on the Patio, complete with Mariachis and tamales! On Thursday, a number of Swifties accompanied Admiral Hoffmann on a tour to the Warrior and Support Center at Fort Sam Houston. The SBSA donated \$5,000 to this facility which cares for our wounded warriors and their families during trying times in their lives. Later that afternoon, some of our members enjoyed a Texas BBQ at Rio Cibolo Ranch, which also included line dancing, hay-rides an old fashion campfire cowboy serenade, and even a cow-chip tossing contest. On Friday, we ventured off to the Texas Hill Country to tour the National Museum of the Pacific War. The SBSA made a donation to the Admiral Nimitz Foundation and dedicated a plaque in memory of PT 41.

Board Chairman, Dave Wallace, took the membership by surprise with news of a project that has been in the works for one and a half years now. Directors Wallace, Erwin, Solhaug and LaVoie have succeeded in moving negotiations forward with the Government of Malta that brings our organization very close to becoming the recipients of Malta Maritime Squadron's P 24 (Swift Boat), now decommissioned. Tentative plans include the transfer of this craft from the east coast to San Diego possibly by an SBSA member crew sea voyage, all or part of the way. Arrangements are also being made to partner with the Maritime Museum in San Diego that will include in-the-water Swift Boat status. We are targeting the 2013 SBSA Reunion to have all plans in place.

The membership was also privileged to hear Senyint Chim's account of his daring rescue from enemy hands in Cambodia on May 10, 1970. The room went silent as he conveyed his gratitude for LT (j.g.) H. Clayton Howze and the crew of PCF-56 for saving his life. I have never FELT words spoken by anyone strike so deep as when Mr. Chim said, in seeing the American flag from the river bank, "(it) was the MOST beautiful thing that I had EVER seen!" QM2 George Allen Nelson also shared his recollections of that day. All indications are that RDSN Phillip C. Beets is the Swiftie who jumped in the river to keep Senyint from drowning, as he could not swim.

I want to thank all of those Swifties that once again answered the call to serve....as SBSA Directors. The membership elected Chuck Rabel, Van Odell, Dave Wallace and Robert Brant to serve a four year term. Dave Wallace was voted back in as Board Chair, Raul Herrera as President, Mike Solhaug, Vice-president, D.C. Current, Secretary, and Gene Hart, Treasurer. Leaving Director posts, after years of dedicated service to the SBSA, are Joe Ponder and Virgil Erwin – BRAVO ZULU gentlemen!

All sailors of TF 115 and the Foundation Board can be justifiably proud of the financial awards made to 504 serious wounded combat comrades in arms, totaling more than \$4,000,000, and that each of these awards were personally delivered by former Swift boat sailors. No financial award from the federal government nor private assistance will ever compensate for the lifelong handicap and incapacities of these courageous men and women, but a sincere appreciation from former combat veterans goes a long way toward physical and mental recovery.
